To all Oregon commercial squid fishers, processors and other interested parties:

The Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife (ODFW) is announcing the opening of an application period for a new Market Squid Advisory Panel (MSAP).

Purpose

The purpose of the MSAP is to provide ODFW with information and industry perspective on the effectiveness and impacts of existing and proposed fishery management measures, and to identify emerging issues that may need to be addressed. The Oregon Fish and Wildlife Commission (Commission) has requested evaluation of specific management measures in the near term: a control date for future development of a restricted participation permit system (i.e., limited entry), net size restrictions, and a vessel monitoring requirement. These will be the initial focus of MSAP discussions, but we expect the need for an advisory panel to continue for the foreseeable future, as long as there is an active Oregon fishery.

Expectations

Members are expected to represent perspectives of participants who are similarly situated, not limited to their own viewpoint. This means reaching out to contacts in their port, state, and/or sector to get broader input on topics under discussion and sharing that with the panel. Members are expected to be courteous, professional, and respectful of all attendees at MSAP meetings. Member names and affiliation will be posted on the ODFW website.

Meetings of the MSAP meetings will be public and will be announced through a news release and on the ODFW website. Priority will be given to discussion with members, with a brief opportunity for general public input at the end of each meeting if time allows.

Meetings will be held at least annually, with additional meetings as needed. We anticipate at least two meetings in 2021 to address Commission requests. In-person attendance is not required, with webinar or conference call options available for all meetings. Meetings will not be recorded, but ODFW staff will take minutes. Meeting summaries will be posted on the ODFW website.

Member terms will be for three years, and members may be reappointed at ODFW's discretion. ODFW may also solicit applications for new members at any time to address gaps in representation or emerging needs.



Application and appointment

An application form is attached to this announcement. Applications must be postmarked or emailed by **August 6, 2021**. ODFW will consider the information on the application to select members representing the diversity of industry participants, including consideration of home port or state, participation in market squid fisheries in Oregon and other West Coast states, and participation in other fisheries. ODFW may also consider licensing, landing, enforcement, and other relevant information in selecting members. We hope to announce appointments about two weeks after the close of the application period.
